PRESENTER PROFILES

Professor Gerald Pillay is the Vice Chancellor and Rector of Liverpool Hope University. A citizen of New Zealand, he was born in the former British colony of Natal in South Africa. He is widely published and has a distinguished academic career. He holds a Doctor of Philosophy degree from Rhodes University and a Doctor of Theology degree from the University of Durban. After lecturing at the University of Durban-Westville, Professor Pillay became Professor of Ecclesiastical History at the University of South Africa in 1988. In 1977, he became Foundation Professor and Head of the Department of Theology and Religious Studies at Otago University, New Zealand's oldest university. Professor Pillay became the first Vice Chancellor of Liverpool Hope University in 2005 when the institution was given full university status. In 2009, he was appointed a Deputy Lieutenant for Merseyside, assisting the Lord Lieutenant of Merseyside in carrying out her role as the Queen's representative. His vision for and contributions to Higher Education, his interest in the welfare of students and staff have positively transformed Liverpool Hope University. His fondness for parks, flowers and trees have enhanced the learning University atmosphere.

Bishop Michael Nazir-Ali is originally from Pakistan and was the first Diocesan Bishop in the Church of England born abroad. Earlier he was the General Secretary of CMS from 1989-1994 and Bishop of Raiwind in Pakistan. He holds both British and Pakistani citizenship and was a member of the House of Lords where he was active in a number of national and international concerns. He now serves as the President of the Oxford Centre for Training, Research, Advocacy and Dialogue (OXTRAD). He had secondary education in Pakistan and read Economics, Sociology and Islamic History at the University of Karachi, and Theology at Fitzwilliam College and Ridley Hall, Cambridge. He is an Honorary Fellow of St. Edmund Hall, Oxford and Fitzwilliam College, Cambridge. He is Senior Fellow of Wycliffe Hall, Oxford. He has been Visiting Professor of Theology and Religious Studies in the University of Greenwich and on the faculties of the London School of Theology affiliated to the Universities of Brunel and Middlesex, the Oxford Centre for Mission Studies, the Alexandria School of Theology and the Lahore College of Theology. He is the author of thirteen books and of numerous articles on Mission, Ecumenism, the Anglican Communion, and relations with people of other faiths (particularly Islam).

Ram Gidoomal, CBE, is an international entrepreneur who has used his business acumen to support the work of numerous public and charitable organizations, and local and global missions. Ram was into a Hindu family, brought up in the Sikh faith and educated at a Muslim school in Kenya, Ram became a Christian believer as a young adult in London. He was chairman of Traidcraft, South Asian Concern, Allia, and the social profit society Future

Business. He was chair of the Lausanne Movement International Board of Directors. He served on the boards of International Justice Mission and the New York City Leadership Centre. Ram is also a Freeman of the City of London and Companion of the Chartered Management Institute. Past roles include UK Chief Executive of the Inlaks Group, Crown appointee to the Court and Council of Imperial College London. He was a candidate for Mayor of London for the Christian People Alliance in 2000 and 2004. He has written several books including *Sari 'n Chips; Chapatis for Tea; Lions, Princesses and Gurus; The UK Maharajahs;* and *How Would Jesus Vote?*

Rev. Dr. Joel Edwards is strategic adviser with Christian Solidarity Worldwide (CSW), a Christian organization working for religious freedom through advocacy and human rights in the pursuit of Justice. He is also a freelance broadcaster with the BBC, a published author and sought after speaker. His wide range of experience include 12 years as a probation officer, pastor, 11 years as general director of the Evangelical Alliance UK and ten years in leadership with Micah Challenge International, a global faith based response to extreme poverty. In addition, he has served on a number of government bodies including Commissioner on the Equality and Human Right Commission UK, the advisory Board on Human Rights and Religious Freedom with the British Foreign and Commonwealth Office, and the Metropolitan Police's Independent Advisory Group (IAG). He currently is an honorary Canon at St. Paul's Cathedral, a Vice President of Barnardos, an advisory member on faith at the Tony Blair Foundation and a Visiting Fellow at Spurgeon's College. Joel has been awarded three honorary doctorates including St. Andrews University.

Professor Andrew F. Walls, OBE is the professor of History of Mission at Liverpool Hope University and honorary professor in the University of Edinburgh and Akrofi-Christaller Institute for Theology, Mission and Culture, Akropong, Ghana. Prof. Walls was born in 1928 in New Milton, England. He studied theology at Exeter College, Oxford, receiving a first-class degree in 1948, and completed his graduate studies in the early Church in 1956. He serves as a missionary to Sierra Leone (where he taught church history at Fourah Bay College) and Nigeria. He taught for many years at the University of Aberdeen and Princeton Theological Seminary before founding the Centre for the Study of Christianity in the Non-Western World at the University of Edinburgh. The Andrew F. Walls Centre for the Study of African and Asian Christianity was founded in his honor at Liverpool Hope University. His pioneering research led the magazine *Christianity Today* to describe him in 2007 as 'a historian ahead of his time' and 'the most important person you don't know'. His publications include *The Missionary Movement in Christian History;* *The Cross-Cultural Process in*

Christian History: Studies in the Transmission and Appropriation of Faith; Mission in the 21st Century (with Cathy Ross) and *Crossing Cultural Frontiers*.

Tani Omideyi, PhD serves as the senior pastor of Temple of Praise, Liverpool. Tani and his wife Modupe started a house group in Liverpool in 1980, having moved there from Nigeria the year before. The house group was the foundation on which they formed Love & Joy Ministries Association of Charities, which includes Temple of Praise congregations. Dr Omideyi has been a director of Together For Harvest (local Evangelical network) since 1997. He is currently an Ecumenical Canon at Liverpool Anglican Cathedral. Tani became the first ethnic minority chair of the Evangelical Alliance UK board.

Prof. Dr. Klaus Koschorke is German historian of Christianity and Professor emeritus of LMU Munich University. He served as the Dean of the Faculty of Protestant Theology, Head of the Institute of Church History and Member of the Senate of the University of Munich. After studying Protestant theology in Berlin, Edinburgh, Tübingen and Heidelberg, Klaus Koschorke completed his doctoral degree in Heidelberg in 1976 with a dissertation on Coptic-Gnostic texts from Nag Hammadi. He was an assistant professor in Bern and qualified as a university lecturer in 1991 with Habilitation thesis on 4th century Greek ecclesiology (Basil of Caesarea). He held guest professorships and teaching positions in Switzerland and in Asia (foremost in Sri Lanka). He is editor/author of many publications including *History of Christianity in Asia, Africa, Latin America, 1450-1900; Polycentric Structure in the History of World Christianity* and others.

Richard Harvey, PhD is a Messianic Jew who teaches the Hebrew Bible (Old Testament), Hebrew language and Jewish studies. Richard has been involved in planting Messianic congregations and evangelism with Jews for Jesus and Church's Ministry among Jewish People. Richard is a member of the Lausanne Consultation on Jewish Evangelism; European Board Member, Jews for Jesus; Vice-President, British Messianic Jewish Alliance; Editorial Board, Mishkan (Academic Journal on Jewish Evangelism and Messianic Judaism) Jerusalem. His writings include 'But I'm Jewish' and 'A Jewish Approach to the Trinity'. A revised version of his thesis is published as "Mapping Messianic Jewish Theology: A Constructive Approach"(2009).

Usha Reifsnider is British Gujarati, from the West Midlands. She and her husband Matt have served as missionaries with Go To Nations since 1988. They spent ten years in a Muslim country ministering to refugees and migrant workers, and served as mission strategists with the International Learning Center, an English language school and church-planting programme for international communities in the USA. Usha holds an M.A. from The

University of Chester, and is currently studying for a Ph.D. at Oxford Centre for Mission Studies, researching diaspora mission. She is a mission partner with Interserve UK.

Alan Tower is National Director for Friends International, a ministry among International students in the UK and Ireland, through 70 staff and 50 Affiliates, local churches and Christian student groups. Alan studied Politics at Newcastle University and has an MBA from Heriot-Watt, Edinburgh; he trained at All Nations Christian College, Hertfordshire with his wife Margaret, and worked in Bolivia in theological education and student ministry with his family, then based in the UK on the staff of Latin Link, and joining Friends International in 2016. He enjoys Wycliffe Baptist Church, Reading, political biography, running and a bit of golf.'

Rev. Henry Lu was born and grew up in Xian, China. After studies at the University of Georgia and Harvard University, he taught Urban Design at the University of Massachusetts for many years. In 2003, Henry got involved in the Chinese diaspora mission through Chinese Overseas Christian Mission (COCM) in the UK and Europe. In 2007, Henry moved to England and had been serving as the General Director of COCM. Over the past twelve years, Henry developed and implemented new mission strategies to evangelise the Chinese students and the local born next generation Chinese. Henry received a MA in mission leadership from All Nations Christian College.

Dr. Peter Vimalasekaran was born in Sri Lanka and experienced a refugee life for several years. Peter studied Accounting and Marketing, and later studied Pastoral Theology at Reformed Baptist Seminary in London. He holds a Diploma in Mission Studies from Irish Baptist College in Northern Ireland. He completed Bachelor of Divinity from the Queen's University of Belfast in 1997 and also Pursued Master of Philosophy at the same Institution. In 2008, he achieved Doctor of Ministry in Intercultural studies in Reformed Theological Seminary. His thesis was titled "A Biblical Model of Refugee Ministry". Peter and his wife Louise with 4 children have been ministering to refugees over 2 decades in Germany and in many other countries.

S Hun Kim is a reflective practitioner and studied as a researcher on the mission and diaspora/ migration at Oxford Centre for Mission Studies, Oxford. He was a Bible translator with Wycliffe (published Azeri Bible in Iran in 2013) and now serves as a diaspora consultant in Europe. Earlier, he served as vice-chair of Global Diaspora Network of the Lausanne movement. Also, involved as a coordinator of Equip7: Learning Community in Europe, helping refugee and Diaspora leaders better equipped for their own ministries. He is also

teaching Diaspora Missiology at Han Dong University, South Korea. He is the editor of *Korean Diaspora and Christian Mission* (Regnum, 2011).

Lazarus Yehghnazar was born in Tehran, Iran in 1949 to an Armenian Christian family. At the age of six he saw a vision of Jesus and committed his life to His service. He married Maggie in 1975 and together they have four children. At age 21 Lazarus was ordained as an elder at the central Assemblies of God Church in Tehran, and was appointed to the Leadership of AOG churches in Iran. He was imprisoned twice before he was 25 for preaching the Gospel in different cities in Iran (during the time of the Shah). After the Islamic Revolution, when the American hostages of the embassy were captured, he was called upon twice to conduct Christmas and Easter services for the hostages. In 1988, after the eight year war between Iran and Iraq, Lazarus and Maggie felt God clearly leading them to leave Iran, first travelling to Switzerland and settled in England. They started 222 Ministries in 1991 to train leaders and equip churches.

Rev. Simon A. Kolawole, PhD is Dean of the Faculty of Theological Studies at Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary, Ogbomoso, Nigeria. He hails from Ipee, Kwara State, Nigeria and was educated in Ipee, Ghana, Asaba, Onitsha, and Offa. He has B.Th, M.Th, and PhD from Nigerian Baptist Theological Seminary (NBTS), Ogbomoso, Nigeria. An erudite theological educator, a versatile philosopher-leader and been a lecturer in the NBTS, Ogbomoso since 2006 and dean since 2016. In addition to numerous Articles, Conference. Papers and Book Chapters, his many books include *The Interplay of Philosophy, Gospel Ministry and National Transformation*, and *Being a Minister of Maximum Impact*.

Zaza Lima is the International Director for PMI, a South American mission organisation with a focus on areas where Islam is the predominant identity. Originally from Brazil, she lived in North Africa for seventeen years and now makes home in Spain. Her ministry has a particular focus on partnership with NGOs, building capacity in empowering children with disabilities and women who are marginalised. Her clear commitment to emerging local churches, passion for Christ and his kingdom, and wholistic mission engagement has allowed her to journey with the least and with leaders in secular and Christian organisations.

Peter Samir is an evangelist, Arabic-speaking missionary, and presenter in "AL-Massira" program, which is a designed program for Arabic people from Muslim background. He is a

graduate of business administration and completed his master's degree in Theology from the Evangelical Theological Seminary in Cairo, Egypt. He was sent from Kasr el Dohara Evangelical Church to Barcelona, Spain in 2002 as a full-time missionary for the North Africans. From 2012 till 2014, he was a full-time at KDEC in Cairo to be part of the mission department and bible study groups for MBBs. In 2014, he has joined Christian Vision Middle East.
